The Department of Agricultural Marketing & Co-operatives (DAMC) is one of the four departments under the Ministry of Agriculture & Forests (MoAF), tasked with facilitating agricultural produce marketing and the development of the co-operative sector. It was established in October 2009 and started to operate as a full-fledged department starting March 2010.

A premier institution for the development of RNR marketing System and promotion of agribusiness, enterprise, and cooperatives for sustainable socio-economic development.

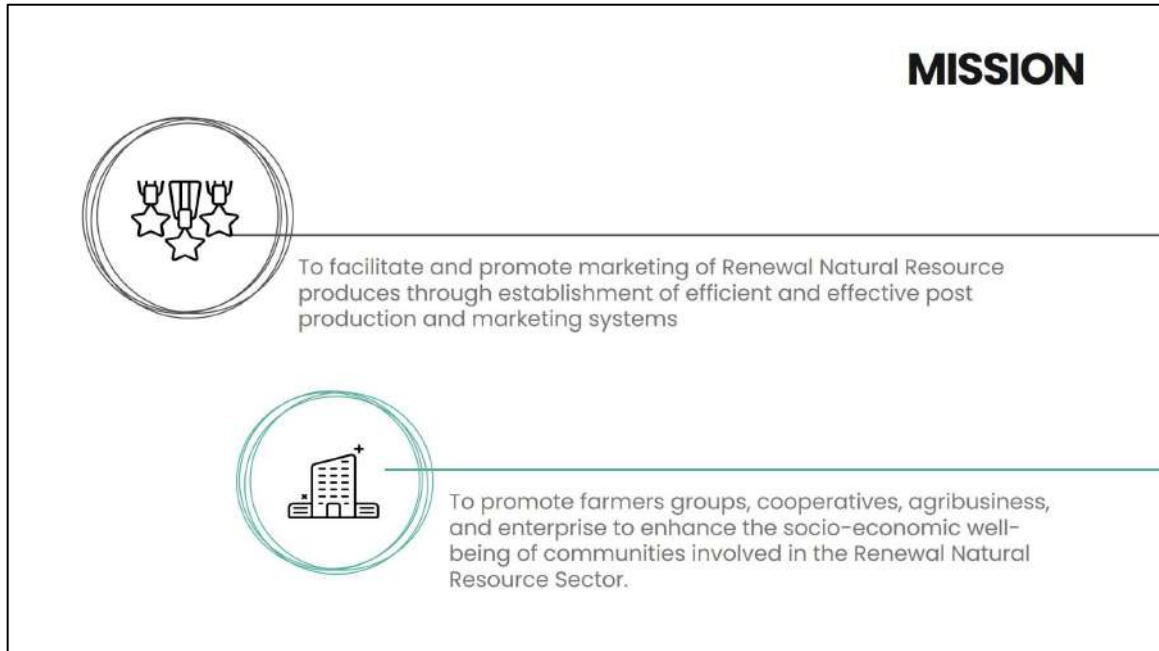


Fig 2. Mission of DAMC

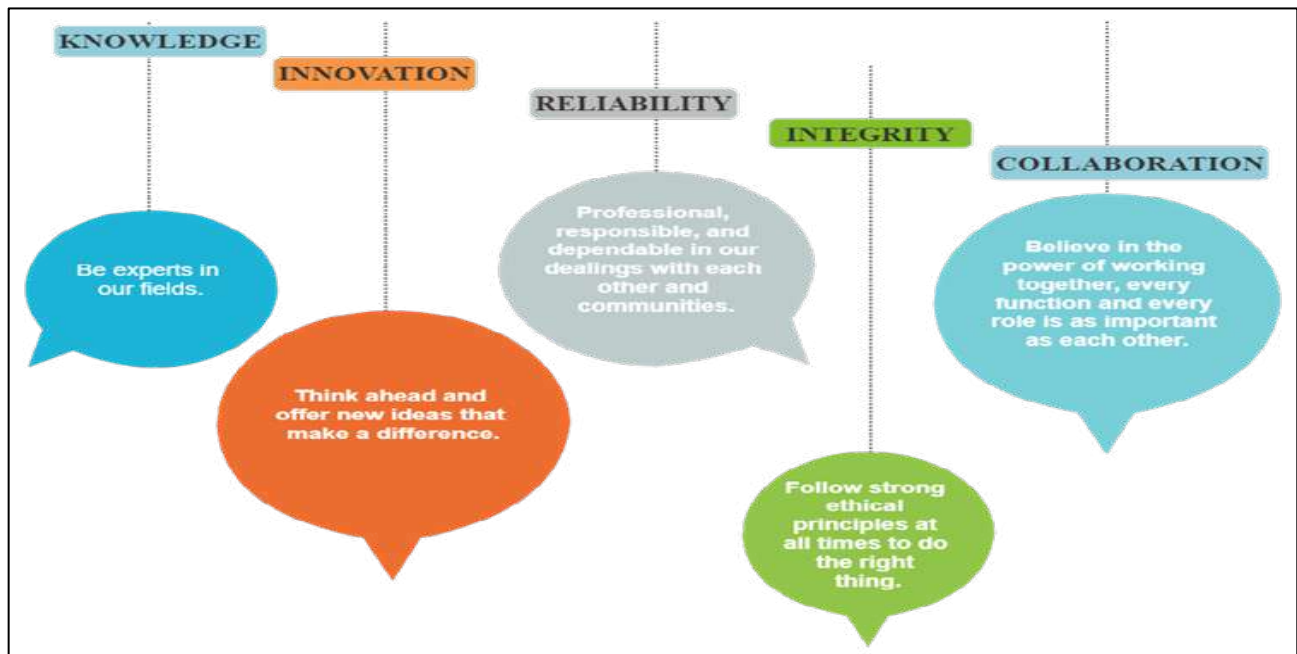


Figure 3: Core values of DAMC

The DAMC has three divisions – Market Development Division, Market Information & Research Division and the Co-operative Development Division, two regional offices, located at Monggar and Gelephu, one market facilitation office (Agricultural Marketing Facilitation Office) at Phuentsholing and National Post Harvest Center at Paro with its sub center at Dagana, Mongar, Pemagatshel and Zhemgang Dzongkhags. The two regional offices provide services to the Dzongkhags in Eastern and Central regions respectively, Agricultural Market Facilitation Office at Phuentsholing provides services to Chhukha and Samtse Dzongkhags. The services to the Dzongkhags in the western region are catered from the Department Headquarter.

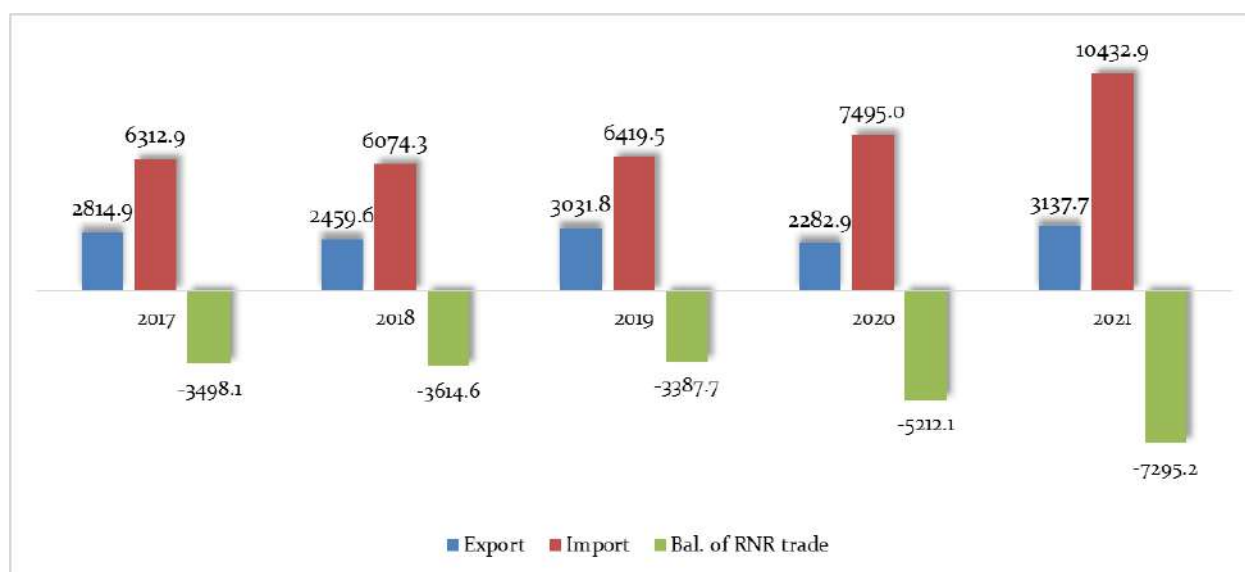
In addition, the Department has two Commercial Attaches placed under one in Royal Bhutanese Embassy, Dhaka, Bangladesh and the other in Royal Bhutanese Consulate, Kolkata, India; who facilitates and supports trade of all goods and export of Bhutanese agricultural produce in particular.

The department has a staff strength of 101, and currently only 83 staff are on active duty; with some positions yet to be filled.

#### **RNR Trade at the Macro Level**

RNR commodity trade is an important economic activity in the country. Bhutan exports a substantial volume of spice (mainly cardamom and ginger), vegetables (mainly potatoes) and fruits (mainly apples and mandarin). Non-wood forest products such as cordycep sinensis, pipla and chirata are also important for the Bhutanese economy.

Rice is by far the biggest import commodity amongst the food commodities. In the year 2021 alone, rice worth more than Nu.2618 million was imported into the country. Vegetables, mainly during winter oilseeds, spices, wheat, edible oil (ready to consume cooking oil) and meat are also big import items. Meat worth Nu.1164.53m was imported mainly from across the neighboring Indian States.



Although there was a drastic reduction in export in 2020 from 2019, the export again picked up in 2021. However, during the same period the import also saw a substantial increase. As of 2021, the overall balance of trade in RNR commodities is not in our favor.

While being a net importer of rice, oilseeds, wheat and meat, Bhutan exports substantial value of spices, fruits, nuts and non-wood forest products.

## Domestic Trade

Most of the domestic trade is executed by the private traders or the producers themselves without much government intervention in marketing. However, due to COVID-19, the department with other relevant stakeholders facilitated domestic trading through business linkages, market infrastructure, and packaging material support and in some cases transportation support.

The vegetables, fruits and spices were sourced to Thimphu from Chhukha, Tsirang, Punakha and Wangduephodrang. FCBL distributed about 160 MT of potato in Thimphu.

## Value Chain Studies, Market Research and Market Information System

### 1.1 Value Chain Studies

#### 1.1.1 Value chain study on winter chili and minor cereals

Two value chain analysis on winter chili and minor cereals (barley and millet) have been completed in the fiscal year 2021-2022. The analysis was concentrated only in those dzongkhags with major production of the identified commodity for the study.

The two value chain analysis is developed for a thorough understanding of the functioning of the chain, understand the different agents and stakeholders in the chain, get insights into the marketing aspects of the chain with respect to the value added by each agent, understand the constraints and issues at each level (production, marketing, imports, and processing). The objective of the initiative is to conduct a thorough analysis of the commodities that hold promise as potential areas of growth for agricultural and rural development.

### 1.1.2 Implementation of recommendations from past VC studies (Buckwheat and Maize)

One of the critical recommendations of Buckwheat Value Chain Analysis and Maize Value Chain Analysis 2019 is to encourage commercial production and increasing economic benefits at all levels of actors across the chain by bringing together the producers, processors, retailers and exporters so that formal market linkages are created and through promotion of value addition and vigorous exploration of export markets.

An extensive consultation was held between the farmers (organic buckwheat growers) of Langpa-Norbugang, Samar Gewog and B-Organic on June 9, 2022 at Choetengang under Samar Gewog. This event was preceded by a meeting with the Dzongkhag Agriculture Office (DAO) and Dzongkhag Livestock Office (DLO), and Samar Gewog Agriculture Extension Office, Haa was held on May 8, 2022 in the DAO. Mr. Dorji Gyeltshen, the founder and the Chief Executive Officer of B-Organic, made a presentation on the background, objectives, product development, marketing, success experience and future prospect and plan pertaining to buckwheat tea.

The two days each meeting was conducted between farmers and traders starting from Nanong, Pemagatshel on 21<sup>st</sup> June 2022 and end from Domkhar, Lhuntse on 25<sup>th</sup> June 2022. The participants of the meeting were from various stakeholders including Chiwog Tshogpa, Agriculture Extension Agent, farmers and traders. The memorandum of understanding (MoU) signing between farmers and traders was facilitated by RAMCO with fund support from GEF-LDCF. In the first day interested maize growers were made aware on benefits and challenges of linking, post-harvest, quality requirement and issues related to maize marketing. During the second day only interested farmers were called and discussed the MoU in detail. A total of 45 households of Lhuntse and 115 households of Pemagatshel Dzongkhags were linked with two traders.

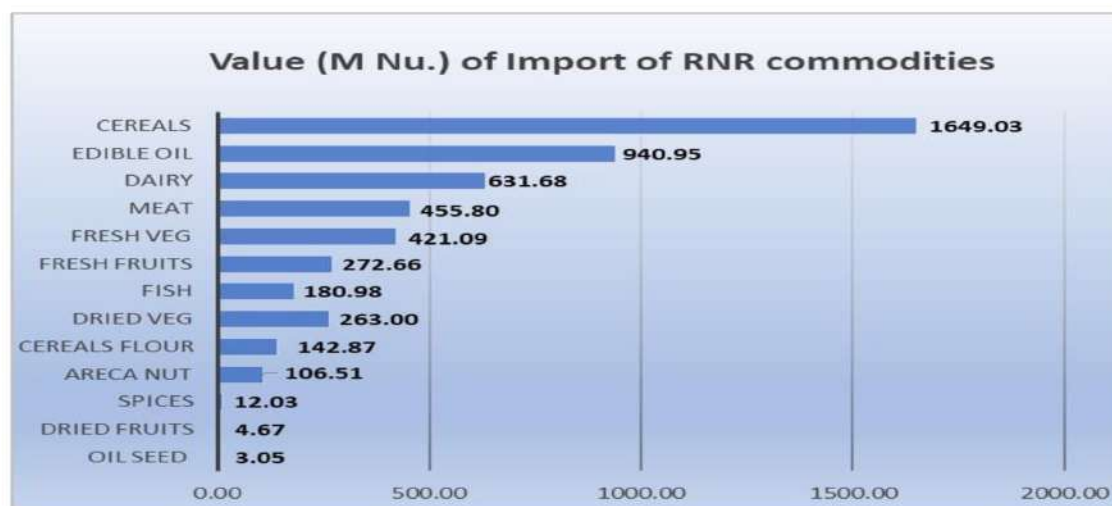
## Market Research and Information

### 4.1.3.1 Post-production Intervention on potato

Export of potato in Bhutan has faced some challenges over the last few years with India formalizing the trade. Therefore, the report places an insight on the bilateral trade opportunities for Bhutan with India, Bangladesh, Nepal and Thailand and the need to pursue in getting rid of existing trade barriers with India and promote potato export market in other countries like Bangladesh, Nepal and Thailand.

The report also reveals the export potential of our potatoes and challenges in exporting to Bangladesh, Nepal and Thailand. The findings of the studies will be used as a guide to identify export strategies (product requirements, export markets, competition and regulations) and export barriers (import restrictions, cost implications and product pricing) in the targeted export countries.

### 4.1.3.2 Import Analysis for six months (January to June 2021)

As per the Bhutan Trade Statistics data published by the Department of Revenue and Customs, Ministry of Finance, we have imported 103,872 MT of RNR commodities worth over Nu. 5,084 million during the period Jan-Jun, 2021. Import of cereals accounted for 32 percent of the total; the cereals include rice, maize, wheat and buckwheat.

Rice is the major import commodity amongst cereals. Bhutan imported over 50,921 MT of rice worth Nu. 1,436.20m along with other RNR commodities during the period.

#### 4.1.4 Development of Buying and Selling Platform

The platform is an online marketplace for farmers, producers, traders and consumers who can buy and sell renewable natural resource (RNR) products. It had been developed for easier market accessibility for the actors involved in the supply chain without involvement of intermediaries. The platform has been visioned to be our users' best marketplace and also reduce cost in RNR marketing the products.

#### 1.1.3 Data Analysis - export data

Unlike in the past, due to COVID-19 pandemic, the department continued to facilitate export of agricultural commodities from five gateways and compiled firsthand information. The facilitation benefited the farmers, producers and traders.

The following are the records of the export facilitation from various export gateways in MT.

## Training and Workshop

### 1.1.4 Training on Value Chain Analysis and Small Business Development Program

The overall objective of the training is to enhance the skills of government officials to conduct value chain analysis, identify business opportunities, and prepare business proposals for commodities in the agriculture, livestock and forestry sectors in the Bhutanese context. At the end of the training, the participants shall be able to better coordinate and advice on: the 12th FYP's Programme 2: Value Chain and Enterprise Development Programme; they shall be able to better analyze value chain analysis (VCA) studies and prepare business models for entrepreneurs in key commodities that need to be submitted to the RNR Enterprise Development and Coordination Unit within three months after the training; and they shall lead the formulation of the RNR Marketing Strategy and Plan of Action within six months after the end of the training. This task requires participants to consult stakeholders within and outside the RNR sector.

### 3.2.3 Training of Farmers group and cooperatives

The main objective of the training is to build the knowledge and skills of the office bearers in leading and managing their group, proper record of books of accounts, generating group cohesion, enhancing participatory decision making, analyzing sources of conflict and resolving it, communicating effectively and to work as a team which will eventually culminate into building trust and boosting the performance and income of the groups. In addition to that, training also aimed at educating the members of the groups in smooth marketing of their products with much care and in a sustainable safety manner.

Most of the aforementioned supports are for value addition/ processing of raw agricultural and livestock

producers. When FGs/ Co-ops are provided

value addition or food processing equipment, it is imperative that they be trained on the proper value addition/ food processing techniques, on the optimal use and care of equipment or facility, to ensure they get the maximum value for money. This on-the-job training is more critical when new technologies and new equipment are put in place. Further, the importance of proper food



handling to ensure food safety cannot be overlooked and has to be a part and parcel of such capacity building program

In 2021-2022, a total of 1,455 members representing 151 Co-operatives and Farmers groups were trained on Post-harvest management & marketing aspects training, Value addition to fruits and vegetables, Record keeping, book keeping and fundamental of marketing, Saving and credit training, Group formation and awareness, Mandarin grading and packaging to youth groups through various funding support. (Annexure )

### Commodity Market Exchange

#### Revival (Potato and Cardamom)

The online auction for potatoes had been suspended due to the pandemic with travel restrictions in and outside the country since 2020. With the easing protocols of the pandemic where travel restrictions are lifted. The department in collaboration with RSEBL and FCBL initiated in reviving the commodity exchange market for potatoes.

FCBL have started identifying strategic locations for the establishment of warehouses and installation of potato grading machines but with insufficient facilities and infrastructure at source, FCBL will not be able to resume the online auctioning this year.

Upon the suggestion of CEO RSEB to pilot the online auction at Damchu, Chhukha, for the place being in the strategic location, the respective offices involved in the task will be working on identification of land, construction of warehouse, installation of grading machines, network connectivity and awareness programs.

### Export Market Facilitation

#### 1.1.5 Trial shipment

The department-initiated preparation of trial shipment of 20 MT mixed RNR produce to Malaysia and 20 MT buckwheat and Adzuki to Japan under the Organic Flagship program.

#### 1.1.6 Buckwheat export

The farmers from 125 households of six eastern Dzongkhags secured Nu.1.4 million through the sale of 20.00 MT sweet buckwheat to Bussi-EN Bhutan Office facilitated by the Regional Agricultural

Marketing and Cooperatives (RAMCO), Mongar. The sweet buckwheat was exported to Japan and the Bussi-EN Bhutan office committed to buy around 20 MT of sweet buckwheat in the coming season.

### 1.1.7 Mandarin export

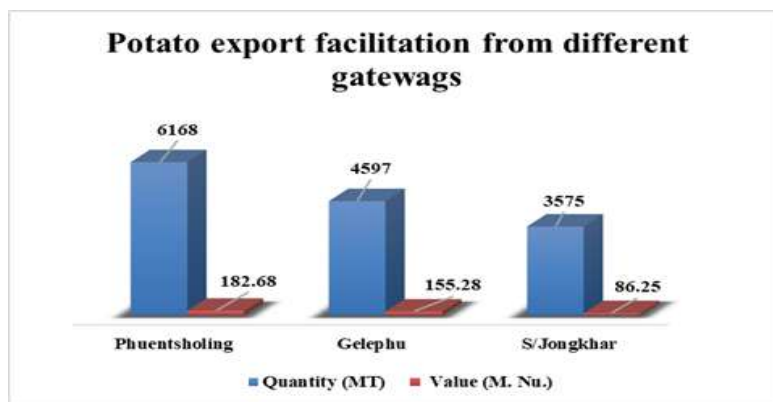
The Department of Agricultural and Marketing and Co-operatives (DAMC) facilitated export of mandarin along with other agricultural produce amid COVID-19 pandemic. The mandarin is one of the major export commodity and the export began from December 2021 till March, 2022. Over 11,279 MT worth Nu. 396.64 million was exported via Phuentsholing, Gelephu, S/Jongkhar, Nganglam and Samtse gateways.

Export to Bangladesh accounted for 84 percent of the total; the rest going to India. Around 8782.27 MT worth Nu. 333.29m was exported to Bangladesh and 2496.84 MT worth Nu. 63.36m was exported to India.

The biggest export occurred via Gelephu with over 5226 MT worth Nu. 207.77m shipped during last season followed by Nganglam with over 2862 Mt worth Nu. 72.64m. The highest offered rate recorded for the said season was Nu. 57.68/kg and the lowest was Nu. 18.52/kg.

### 3.5.4 Potato export

Over 14,341 MT of potatoes worth Nu. 424.21 million was exported via Phuentsholing, Gelephu and Samdrup Jongkhar gateways. The biggest export occurred via Phuentsholing with over 6,168 MT worth Nu. 182.68 million was shipped during last season.



## Farmers Groups and Cooperatives

### 1.2 Farmers groups and Cooperative registration



A total of 62 groups (4 Cooperatives and 58 Farmers Groups) were registered in 2021-2022 of which 24 are Livestock groups and 38 Agriculture groups as in Annexure

A total of 1111 members were registered as FGs/Coops for this fiscal year in which 574 members

are male and 537 members are female.

The Department also assisted in the upgradation of five potential dairy Farmer Groups (FGs) into Cooperatives (Co-ops).

### 1.3 Annual Monitoring and Evaluation (AME) of Farmers Groups and Cooperatives

The Department of Agricultural Marketing and Co-operatives (DAMC) initiated the registration of Farmers' Groups (FGs) and Co-operatives (Co-ops) in August 2010. As of June 2022, there are 677 registered FGs and 102 registered Co-ops. The Department felt the need to evaluate the performance of the FGs and Co-ops on a regular basis which is imperative to the quality of support and intervention that the DAMC makes for their benefit.

Therefore, the Department carried out few basic monitoring and evaluation (M&E) exercises to the 55 FGs/Co-ops to assess their performance and progress and accordingly identify challenges impeding their growth and development and further identify critical areas of support and intervention (equipment and training support).



#### 1.4 Equipment supports to help Value Addition through Cooperative Business Development Scheme (CBuDS)

To ensure that the equipment support goes to the most deserving groups and co-operatives in terms of commitment to the group business and the potential to profit from the extended support, most of the support is delivered through a competitive cost-sharing scheme called Cooperative Business Development Scheme (C-BuDS) and Ministry Cost-Sharing Mechanism.



With the C-BuDS and Ministry Cost-Sharing mechanism in place, in 2020-2021 DAMC has provided value addition equipment worth Nu. 12 million to 33 registered farmers groups and cooperatives with funding support from CSI Flagship Program. 8 Farmer Groups and Cooperatives were supported with the value addition equipment under CARLEP Funding worth Nu. 1.5 million and equipment worth 0.408m through WFP funding. (Annexure 3)

#### 4.4 Packaging Support

More often than not, the small and cottage enterprises accord very minimal importance to the presentation and packaging of the finished products – both of which are critical in the protection of the finished goods as well as in the promotion and marketing of it.

Therefore, to support very promising FG/Co-ops that have reached an advanced stage of product development or are already producing marketable goods, in introducing and using appropriate packaging methods and materials, through provision of packaging equipment and pre-printed packaging materials, FG/Coops are supported with the packaging support each year through flagship program.

24 numbers of registered FG/Co-op are provided with the packaging equipment or materials for this financial year 2021-22 under our Department (Annexure)

#### 4.5 Support to FGs/Coops with product promotion

The Department has been providing opportunities and platforms for the FGs/Co-ops to participate in national and international trade fairs to exhibit and promote their products. However, being mindful of the risks posed by the ongoing pandemic and ensuring wider outreach of the product, the Co-operative Development Division in collaboration with the Regional offices optimized on the audio-visual platform for quality video product promotion. Therefore, upon consultation with the FGs/Coops and the regional offices, value added products of 10 FGs/Coops (Annexure 4) were identified to be promoted digitally on various online platforms.

#### 4.6 Online Registration and Information Management of Farmer Groups and Cooperatives.

One of the main functions of the division is the registration, development, strengthening of Farmers Group (FGs) and Co-operatives (Coops).



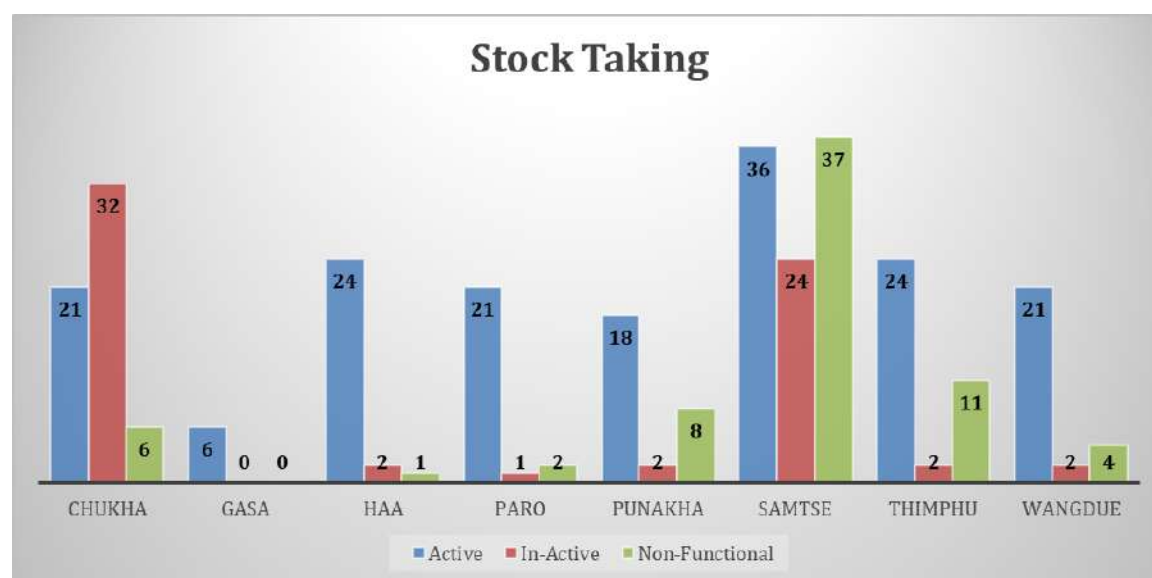

The Division at present is carrying out the registration of FGs and Coops manually, which is time consuming, cumbersome and expensive. In order to overcome the drawback in registration and to further promote and monitor FGs and Coops, DAMC in collaboration with the ICTD, MoAF and in consultation with the NGN consultant has developed Online Registration and Information Management of Farmer Groups and Cooperatives system which is currently in the staging server and live testing mode and eventually launching the system very soon. The system would greatly enhance the efficiency of the department by reducing the administrative burden; reducing paper usage, efficient documentation, easily accessible information and management of FGs and Coops.

#### 4.7 Stock taking of the registered FGs/Co-ops in the country.

99 Cooperatives (Coop) and 659 Farmer Groups (FGs) are registered with DAMC as of December 2021 mainly to facilitate economic development. Furthermore, it also contributed in promoting Group and Cooperative culture in the country which enhanced the well-being of members and communities through social cohesion.

While some of the FGs/Coops are performing well, it came to the notice of the Department that almost half of the registered FGs/Coops are either inactive which requires revitalization or non-functional which needs to be dissolved. Brief information on categorization of FGs/Coops of the 8 Dzongkhags which are under the purview of CDD are as shown below:



In view of the above, a study is conducted with the following objectives:

- Have correct & updated information on FGs/Coops;
- Formally dissolve non-functional FGs/Coops as per CAB 2009;
- Consolidate intervention/support rendered by DAMC; and,
- Identify interventions to support active FGs/Coops.

Preliminary data and information were gathered through desk review and telephone calls by respective Focal Officials for each Dzongkhag. To validate the information/data and also to gather additional information/data, if any, DAMC officials visit respective Dzongkhags to which they are assigned as Focal. The main purpose for the field visit is to collect information through structured and semi-structured interviews with key stakeholders.

#### 1.4.1 Positive income turnover FGs/Coops

As per the financial progress information collected from the Farmer Groups and Cooperatives, it was found out that total of 69 Farmer Groups and Cooperatives (55 underperforming FGs/Coops mentored and provided critical support and 14 FGs/Coops with support of equipment) had positive income turnover in 2021-2022 fiscal year compared to FY 2020-2021 upon having availed support from different government agencies as in Annexure 7.

#### 1.4.2 Employment generated through FGs/Coops

During this Fiscal year, a total of 91 new paid jobs - Accountants, marketing person, processing, chairman, milk collector, accountant, etc. were created in the various FGs/Coops and their related small RNR based enterprises. The employment details are in the Annexure

#### 1.5 Linking Schools and Hospital with producer groups

The department has continued to lead the implementation of the School and Hospital Feeding Program (SHFP). During this financial year, DAMC has created business linkages through new linkages creation and contract renewal. In total, the department has renewed contractual agreements of 255 schools with 522 suppliers, and two hospitals with two suppliers. Further, the department has established new business linkages of 81 schools with 130 suppliers, and three hospitals with five suppliers.

In efforts to further strengthen the program, feasibility to decentralize the SHFP was thoroughly reviewed. Consultation and coordination meetings were conducted across 11 Dzongkhags (Paro, Gasa, Samtse, Zhemgang, Sarpang, Trashigang, Trashiyangtse, Monggar, Lhuntse, Pemagatshel, Samdrup Jongkhar), and three SoEs (FCBL, FMCL, and BLDCL). Findings were presented to the national stakeholders (Ministry of Education, Ministry of Health, Ministry of Finance, GNHC and Dzongkhags), in June and decentralization was further emphasized as the way forward. The proposal to decentralize the program will be submitted to the Cabinet through the Ministry.

### Market Infrastructure

Market Infrastructure (MI) establishment is a challenging task particularly to get land at a strategic location that is suitable from a market perspective. Most of the time is spent in looking for a suitable site, seeking endorsement of the beneficiaries and concerned LG authority, technical feasibility study, and working out the technical details by the Dzongkhag Engineers. During this period, the department supported establishment of various market infrastructures at various dzongkhags

### **Dzongkhag RNR Marketing Action Plan**

In line with the RNR Marketing Strategy 2021 of the Ministry to have an effective and efficient marketing systems for the RNR produces, the department has facilitated formulation of Dzongkhag RNR Marketing Action Plan in close collaboration with the Dzongkhags involving relevant officials from Dzongkhags, Gewogs, SoEs, Entrepreneurs, Aggregators, and farmer groups. The Dzongkhags are Paro, Chhukha, Dagana, Sarpang, and Pemagatshel.

### **Construction of Cold Stores**

Three numbers of Cold Stores, one each in Samtse, Dagana and Zhemgang were planned to be constructed with a schedule of completion of all the ground works, concepts, estimate, design and tender during the year. The cold stores were to be constructed by FCBL with facilitation and assistance from DAMC. As scheduled the ground works have been completed during the year with tender being awarded and the structures under construction.

As planned, an assessment of project feasibility including site suitability, land acquisition, preparation of design, layout and cost estimation were completed, and Nu. 10 million released for commencing the work including site development for the construction of an integrated cold store (ICS) in Zhemgang within in the FY 2021-2022. An additional fund amounting to Nu. 21.60 million has to be released in the FY 2022-2023. Like the ongoing construction of 3 ICS (in Sarpang, Trashigang and Wangdue Phodrang), the progress of ICS establishment project in Zhemgang, which is being implemented by the FCBL, has been greatly hampered by the lack of skilled labour coupled with a series of successive national lockdowns and the travel control due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The project is targeted to be completed by December, 2022.

### **Cordyceps Marketing**

Due to ensuing risks of the COVID-19 pandemic and the restrictions imposed to reduce the risk of spread of the virus, cordyceps auction was not planned by the Department of Agricultural Marketing and Cooperatives (DAMC), Ministry of Agriculture and Forests (MoAF). In place of auction, the DAMC facilitated direct-buying and selling where the contact details of 54 interested cordyceps buyer were shared with the collectors directly to make the business transactions.

However, some cordyceps collectors of Bumthang Dzongkhag claimed about the poor prices the cordyceps fetched. Therefore, with the intention to help cordyceps collectors get higher prices and also to give a better platform to the buyers, the DAMC facilitated the conduct of cordyceps auction at Bumthang on September 06-07, 2021, seeking approval from the Royal Government. This auction was coordinated in collaboration with DoFPS, BAFRA, Dzongkhag Administration, and Gewog Administration, in line with the Cordyceps Auction Guideline 2019.

18 bidders and 135 cordyceps collectors took part in the auction. From a total of 25.97 kilograms cordyceps declared at the auction site, over 17 kilograms (over 65%) of cordyceps was sold through auction. Close to nine kilograms (over 34%) of cordyceps was withdrawn by 67 collectors. Overall, the revenue generated through sales of cordyceps by the collectors was Nu. 6.770 million while Nu. 0.218 million was collected as royalty to the Royal Government. As evident from the table 1, highest bid value is Nu. 1.225 million and the lowest is Nu. 0.112 million.

### Buy Back Program

While being associated with farm-shops, the main objectives of the buy-back program was envisaged:

1. To establish alternative marketing channel for small-holder farmers.
2. To facilitate marketing of semi-commercial production
3. To promote market-led production in long run.
4. To facilitate aggregation, value addition and marketing through farmers groups and cooperatives.

During the period, FCBL bought Ginger and Potato under the Buy-back Scheme from farmers as detailed below:

Replacing the *Buy-back Scheme, Incentive Scheme for Market-led Production for RNR commodities* is instituted from the year 2022. The RNR Marketing Strategy 2021 has identified “promotion of market-led production” as one of the strategies to strengthen the production and marketing of RNR commodities. Towards this, the incentive for production of market led RNR commodities scheme is being introduced.

The scheme is aimed at incentivizing farmers to promote production of RNR commodities that contribute towards achieving national food security, have better nutritional value, have potential for higher incomes to farmers, and enhance import substitution and export promotion. The scheme will compensate farmers, at a pre-determined price, should there be no demand for RNR commodities produced or the prevailing market price is less than the cost of production.

The commodities are categorized under three categories and commodities under each category shall be identified by the Task Force, annually.

1.1 Category A: Under this category, commodities that have shortage of domestic production, requires import, essential in our dietary habit and with nutritional value, shall be considered. RGOB shall consider to offer 10-20 percent higher than cost of production (COP), with exception of winter chili with 200%.

1.2 Category B: Under this category, commodities with export opportunities, import substitution and that are on promotion by the technical departments for food security, shall be considered. RGOB shall offer buyback price at par with COP.

1.3 Category C: Under this category, RNR commodities that are commercially grown by farmers as cash crop but not necessarily contribute to import substitution nor essential for dietary habits, shall be considered. RGOB shall offer BBP of 30-50% lower than COP.



### **Linking Aggregator**

One of the issues in RNR marketing is inadequate volume of produce in some commodities which are economically not viable for any middlemen to venture into RNR aggregation business. Whatever small surplus of produce available for marketing are scattered across difficult terrains making the cost of collection and aggregation very high and incurring huge handling losses, compounding to the already very high cost of production. The huge difference between the farm gate and market price is also attributed to the same reason. Therefore, there are hardly any middlemen working fulltime for collection and aggregation of RNR produce for further marketing. It is either transporters, taxi drivers or the other businessmen who have other main business, who does the role of collection and aggregation only as part time job, whenever seen as opportunity to make income.

However, as more and more farmers are producing on a commercial basis, the need for aggregators in the RNR marketing value chain is more apparent than ever. It is not too early, if not late, to formalize the interested aggregators through proper registration, recognition and hand holding them with some support wherever required

The RNR Aggregators are introduced and formalized in the RNR Marketing Value Chain with following objectives;

1. To strengthen the RNR marketing Value Chain and improve the marketing efficiency
2. To provide farm gate buyers for the producers by taking aggregators right at the farm gate
3. To make economies of scale and business viable in RNR marketing.
4. To collect information on volume of RNR produce marketed in the domestic markets.

#### **Roles and responsibilities of aggregator**

In order to help producers to market their farm produce, the registered aggregators shall;

1. Make contact with producers in their jurisdiction of operation and determine the surplus volume of RNR commodities for sale.
2. Make contact with wholesalers and retailers of various domestic markets and determine the market demand.
3. Make contact with small processors and agro industries and determine their demand for RNR commodities as raw materials.

4. Explore export market opportunities should there be surplus volume beyond the absorption capacity of the domestic markets.
5. Negotiate purchase price and selling price with the producers and wholesalers/retailers/processors respectively.
6. Procure, aggregate, and supply across the markets.
7. Submit an annual report of their business turnover in terms of volume and value of RNR commodities marketed.

The department in this financial year was successful in identifying 132 aggregators in collaboration with Dzongkhag Administrations. A coordination meeting with Aggregators of Eastern Bhutan was conducted in May 2022.

It is reported that majority of Aggregators identified are playing crucial roles in marketing RNR produces of respective Dzongkhags. Aggregators buy produces from designate gewogs/Dzongkhags and distribute them in nearby markets. For example, Aggregators based in Dagana Dzongkhag have designated gewogs to collect RNR produce from the local community and also have designated markets to distribute.

### **Establishment of an RNR based Enterprise**

The Department, upon consultation and collaboration with the Dzongkhag Administration following enterprises were established in 2021-22:
